

Articulation Agreement

FIRE School of Ministry and The King's University

Recognizing the historic and unified vision of FIRE School of Ministry and The King's University to train the next generation for life-transforming ministry, this Articulation Agreement presents a formal collaboration between the two institutions for the purpose of fulfilling the mission of both schools. As institutions committed to preparing students for the servant leadership in the Church and community, FIRE School of Ministry and The King's University agree to the following:

Acceptance of FSM Graduates: The King's University, accredited by the Association of Biblical Higher Education and the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools, agrees to accept into its degree programs qualified FIRE School of Ministry graduates who have been accepted to attend The King's University.

Transfer of Credit: The King's University, which abides by the institutional transfer guidelines articulated by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) agrees to transfer into its degree programs course credit earned FIRE School of Ministry. Course transfer is based upon a course for course evaluation and must have an earned grade of C or higher to be eligible for transfer consideration. The total number of units transferred into individual degree programs are regulated by the current academic catalog at the time of transfer and the established course equivalencies.

Scholarships and Financial Aid: The King's University participates in the Federal Student Aid Program. Additionally, FIRE School of Ministry graduates who enroll in classes on the Gateway Campus will qualify to apply for The Blessed Life Scholarship, which awards annual scholarships based on the number of hours registered.

Administration and Support Services FIRE School of Ministry agrees to annually provide The King's University with current course syllabi, academic catalog, and a faculty roster indicating the academic credentials and qualifications of faculty teaching each course in the curriculum. FIRE School of Ministry and The King's University agree to extend consideration and support in administrative areas to ensure the smooth transition FIRE School of Ministry students who transfer to The King's University. This includes facilitating academic transcript requests and official documents to assist in the transfer of students.

Communications: Both FIRE School of Ministry and The King's University affirm the right to promote this articulation agreement and its terms in appropriate communications. This includes advertisements, promotional events, web site, alumni, and communications such as bulletins, newsletters, and catalogs.

This agreement is in effect in perpetuity unless written notice is provided by either party regarding revision or discontinuation. It is our prayer that this agreement will foster a partnership that will enhance the fulfillment of the mission and objectives of each institution and advance the work of the Kingdom of God.
