



Articulation Agreement

Lakewood Church Internship and The King's University

Recognizing the historic and unified vision of the Lakewood Church Internship program and The King's University to train the next generation for life-transforming ministry, this Articulation Agreement presents a formal collaboration between the two institutions for the purpose of fulfilling the mission of both schools. As institutions committed to preparing students for the servant leadership in the Church and community, Lakewood Church and The King's University agree to the following:

Acceptance of Lakewood Internship Graduates: The King's University, accredited by the Association of Biblical Higher Education and the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools, agrees to accept into its degree programs qualified Lakewood Internship graduates who have been accepted to attend The King's University.

Transfer of Credit: The King's University, which abides by the institutional transfer guidelines articulated by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA) agrees to transfer into its degree programs course credit earned at the Lakewood Church Internship. Course transfer is based upon a course for course evaluation and must have an earned grade of C or higher to be eligible for transfer consideration. The total number of units transferred into individual degree programs are regulated by the established Course Equivalency table.

Pastoral Training: Lakewood Church agrees to pay tuition expenses, fees and associated costs associated with the one-day residencies on their campus, (including a stipend for traveling faculty, travel costs, facilities and hospitality for the classes), with enrollment in the Certificate of Biblical Studies for designated pastoral staff of Lakewood. The individual pastors are responsible for making application to attend TKU and meet all admissions requirements.

Scholarships and Financial Aid: The King's University participates in the Federal Student Aid Program. Additionally, Lakewood Internship graduates who enroll in classes on the Gateway Campus will qualify to apply for The Blessed Life Scholarship, which awards annual scholarships based on the number of hours registered. The King's University will provide a ten percent tuition discount for tuition charged under the Pastoral Training provision above.

Administration and Support Services: Lakewood Church Internship agrees to annually provide the King's University with current course syllabi, academic catalog, and a faculty roster indicating the academic credentials and qualifications of faculty teaching each course in the curriculum. Lakewood Church Internship and The King's University agree to extend consideration and support in administrative areas to ensure the smooth transition of the Lakewood Church Interns who transfer to The King's University. This includes facilitating academic transcript requests and official documents to assist in the transfer of students.
